Financial Statements for the Eighteen Months ended 31 December 2014

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### Statement of Board Responsibilities

Mayo, Sligo and Leitrim Education and Training Board was established on 1 July 2013 under the provisions of the Education and Training Boards Act 2013.

Section 51 of that Act requires the Education and Training Board to keep in such form and in respect of such accounting periods as may be approved by the Minister for Education and Skills with the consent of the Minister for Finance and the Minister for Public Expenditure and Reform, all proper and usual accounts of the monies received or expended by it.

In preparing those accounts, the Board is required to:

- (a) apply the standard accounting policies for the preparation of Education and Training Board financial statements
- (b) make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent
- (c) disclose and explain any material departures from the standard accounting policies.

The Board is responsible for keeping proper books of account which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Board and which enable it to ensure that the Financial Statements comply with section 51 of the Education and Training Boards Act 2013. The Board is also responsible for safeguarding its assets and for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

#### Statement on Internal Control

Mayo, Sligo and Leitrim Education and Training Board (MSLETB) came into being on 1 July 2013 under the provisions of the Education and Training Boards Act 2013. On that date, MSLETB took over the functions of the former County VECs of Mayo, Sligo and Leitrim. With effect from 1 July 2014, MSLETB took over, from SOLAS, the assets, liabilities and the management of the activities of the Sligo and Ballina Training Centres.

The Code of Governance for ETBs is set out in Circular Letter 18/2015, which was issued by the Department of Education and Skills to all ETBs on 16th March 2015. The Code of Governance was adopted by MSLETB at its meeting of 23rd June, 2015. The Code was adopted initially for one year due to the Board's concern about the ability of the Chairperson, Chief Executive and the Board to confirm the many requirements laid out in the Code. It was decided that the Board would review its decision when the Department of Education and Skills put an adequate staffing and organisational structure in place which would facilitate the effective and efficient operation of the Board in a corporate governance context. At the MSLETB Board Meeting on 11th April 2017, the Board resolved to qualify its adoption of the Code of Practice without Section 3.17. Section 3.17 recommends that the Chairperson should not be a member of staff or connected to a member of staff in the ETB. It is confirmed that the current and previous Chairpersons are/were not members of staff and not connected to a member of staff of MSLETB.

Prior to the ETB Code of Governance issued in March 2015, MSLETB operated under the provisions of the Code of Governance for VECs issued in 2005. MSLETB completed the process of appointing its Finance and Audit Committees at its meeting held on 12 May 2015.

As Chairperson of MSLETB, I acknowledge the responsibility of the Board for ensuring that an efficient and effective system of internal financial control is maintained and operated. The system can only provide reasonable and not absolute assurance that assets are safeguarded, transactions are authorised and properly recorded, and that material errors or irregularities are either prevented or would be detected in a timely period.

#### **Key Control Procedures**

The Board has taken steps to ensure an appropriate control environment by:

- Clearly identifying management and staff responsibilities.
- Establishing procedures for reporting control failures and ensuring appropriate action.
- Establishing procedures for identifying and evaluating all risks which could prevent MSLETB from achieving its objectives.

The system of internal financial control operated in MSLETB is based on:

- Detailed administrative procedures
- Segregation of duties
- Specific authorisations
- Internal checks

#### Statement on Internal Control

Monthly management review of reports outlining the actual and budgeted results of programmes operated by MSLETB. Reports are generated comparing actual expenditure versus budget for all school and training programmes. Schools expenditures are reported on a monthly basis to MSLETB Directors. These reports are communicated to School Principals and reviewed by the Senior Management Team in MSLETB. For Further Education and Training (FET), there are three reviews carried out during the year - in June, October & January. The FET reviews are reported to MSLETB management and to SOLAS, which funds and monitors overall delivery of FET programmes.

The Board's monitoring and review of the effectiveness of the system of internal control is informed by the:

- Recommendations made by the Office of the Comptroller and Auditor General (OC&AG) in management letters or other reports.
- Chief Executive, who has responsibility for the financial control framework.
- Work of the Audit Committee, which considers internal audit reports, reports of the C&AG and reports to the Board regarding whether the Chief Executive is, in the internal auditor's opinion, operating adequate and appropriate systems of internal control.

However, no Audit Committee meetings were held during the 2013/2014 period. The first Audit Committee meeting was held on 20 August 2015. The present CE and senior management are unable to give reasons why a meeting did not take place earlier, as the personnel involved are either deceased, retired or on long-term illness leave. However, some factors contributing to lack of meetings by this committee may have stemmed from a lack of clarity as to the committee function (the governance circular issued in March 2015) and that no training had taken place.

An internal audit service is provided by the Internal Audit Unit (IAU). Internal audits being conducted in 2017 are covering the areas of teacher allocation and training centre operations. During the 2013/2014 period, there were two internal audits carried out covering:

- a. Adequacy and effectiveness of internal controls in the areas of receipts, PLC receipts and night class receipts (carried out in March and September 2014 - report issued in 2015).
- b. Youthreach compliance audit in relation to previous audits carried out in 2008 and 2013 for Co. Mayo and Co. Sligo VECs respectively.(carried out in May 2014 report issued in 2015).

#### Statement on Internal Control

#### **Annual Review of Controls**

MSLETB is committed to operating an efficient, effective and economic internal control system. While no formal review of the effectiveness of the system of internal financial control took place in respect of the eighteen-month period ended 31 December 2014, the system was kept under review on an ongoing basis having regard to the findings of the most recent internal audits and comments made by the OC&AG in its management letters.

#### Specific Disclosures in relation to Internal Controls and Accounting Records

MSLETB acknowledges that there were control weaknesses during the 18 months ended 31 December 2014. The following areas were of particular concern: amalgamation of former VECs, governance arrangements, risk management, controls over procurement and incomplete/inaccurate accounting records.

When formed on 1 July 2013, MSLETB faced significant challenges which adversely affected the day-to-day running of the ETB, and which, in turn, prevented prioritisation of the amalgamation process. These challenges include:

- Loss of corporate knowledge/key personnel as there were retirements/resignations of key personnel
- Systems issues MSLETB is using an old outdated single entry system for accounts. In Mayo, the HR system is a manual paper-based system.
- Connectivity issues until late 2016 the ICT connectivity of the offices and centres was inadequate and prevented central consolidation of financial information.
- Geographical spread of MSLETB there are significant distances between the headquarters in Mayo and the other administration offices. Without adequate connectivity between locations, achieving consistency between locations has been complex and labour intensive.

#### Amalgamation of former VECs

Between 1 July 2013 and the end of 2016, MSLETB systems were not integrated. Also, policies and procedures of the former VECs were not aligned. Each of the three former VECs continued to operate the functions - such as payroll, personnel, finance and procurement functions - that had been in place prior to 1 July 2013. This led to duplication of functions, inconsistent procedures, practices and policies and individual accounting records across the ETB. The payroll function for training centre staff was, however, amalgamated into the payroll of the former Mayo VEC in July 2014.

### Statement on Internal Control

#### Governance arrangements

During the 18 month period ending 31 December 2014, there was one finance committee meeting and no audit committee meetings held.

#### Risk management

While there were risk registers for the former VECs, there was no amalgamation or update of these registers until September 2015.

#### Controls over procurement

There is no centralised system of procurement in MSLETB. Large capital contracts are procured at the head office in each county. For smaller capital works and non-capital goods and services, local arrangements are in place. There is also no register of contracts.

### Incomplete/inaccurate accounting records

The system for recording financial transactions used by each of the former VECs is an out-dated single entry system that is not fit for purpose. Different procedures and practices and the loss of expert knowledge across the ETB led to inconsistent identification and allocation of revenues and expenditures. In some cases transactions were not recorded, particularly in relation to payments of grants by Mayo to the other locations. Other items, such as bank interest and charges were also not recorded. As the accounting system is a single entry system, bank account balances are not recorded on it.

### Actions taken to address the challenges

In August 2016, a qualified accountant was employed on a temporary basis in the Finance Officer role specifically to manage the day-to-day finance function, service the audit and to progress the amalgamation of the accounting records databases across the ETB.

Additional resources were provided by the Department of Education and Skills, in particular the staffing support for the project to merge the former VEC accounting records into a single financial database, which was achieved in January 2017. The resources which were sanctioned were three temporary staff at grade 3 level for the duration of the merge from March to December 2016.

There was also upskilling of staff in the finance department during 2016. This was specifically in the areas of receipt classification and preparation of the detailed income and expenditure ledgers as part of the accounts preparation process.

# Delay in the submission of financial statements and accommodation of the audit

Arising out of the significant challenges facing MSLETB outlined above and challenges specific to the compilation of the annual financial statements, the financial statements for the eighteen months ended 31 December 2014 were not submitted to the OC&AG by the required deadline of 1 April 2015 - they were submitted on 9 February 2016. The delay in preparing the financial statements was caused by the following main challenges. These challenges include that

- Financial statements were prepared for each former VEC in the format used by VECs prior to July 2013. For each former VEC location it was necessary to consolidate the receipts records and payments records for July to December 2013 and January to December 2014 for each of the three former VEC locations 12 sets of former VEC records in total. The receipts and payments records of the training centre for July to December 2014 were also consolidated.
- The financial statements are constructed in the first instance by reference to the receipts and payments in the period. The financial position of the ETB is then separately calculated by reference to opening debtors or creditors, receipts and payments giving the closing debtors and creditors. There are separate working papers to establish the closing position for each county and the training centre as well as a consolidated working paper for MSLETB as a whole.
- 3 The consolidation of each of the former VEC's financial statements, along with the transactions arising from the training centre, was a complex and lengthy process.
- In September 2015, the Department of Education and Skills issued a new accounts template. A significant effort was required to align the format and layout of the accounts in preparation for the presentation of the ETB's first accounts for the 18-month period ended 31 December 2014.

The MSLETB financial statements for 18 months ended 31 December 2014 were submitted to the OC&AG on 9 February 2016. It is notable that Financial statements for each of the former VECs for the six-month period ended 30 June 2013 were prepared and submitted for audit in 2014.

However, due to the absence of key finance personnel and the work-related demands in the day-to-day running of the ETB, it was not possible to accommodate the audit until July 2016.

### Issues arising with the financial statements

The financial statements for the 18 months ended 31 December 2014 could not proceed to be certified by the C&AG as they could not be fully reconciled to the

- individual financial statements for each county
- accounting records maintained in each county
- bank statements or
- receipts from other state organisations compared with payments to MSLETB as advised by those organisations.

#### This arose due to:

- The loss of key personnel with expertise in preparing the accounts.
- The issues surrounding incomplete and inaccurate accounting records
- In compiling the individual and the consolidated financial statements, manual adjustments were made which were not recorded in the accounting records and could not be verified by the audit.

As a result, the OC&AG suspended the audit in November 2016.

#### Statement on Internal Control

Actions to provide accurate accounting records and revised financial statements To address the inaccuracies and inability to audit the accounts, MSLETB put the following procedures in place:

- The accounting records for each county were reviewed and manually extended in spreadsheet format to include transactions and adjustments that had not previously been recorded. The review consisted of a review of bank records, unrecorded adjustments and originating documentation.
- These spreadsheet versions of the accounting records were also extended to include the specific line items to which each transaction would be allocated in the financial statements
- New financial statements for each county were reconstructed using filtering options to allocate incomes and expenditures to each line item.
- Revised working papers for each county, the training centre and MSLETB as a whole were constructed to give the overall financial positions.
- The revised individual financial statements and working papers were consolidated into the overall MSLETB revised financial statements.

The revised financial statements, manually extended accounting records and revised financial position working papers were submitted to the OC&AG on 30 June 2017.

The same procedures were required to prepare the financial statements for 2015 and 2016. The 2015 financial statements were submitted to the OC&AG on 10 July 2017 and the 2015 audit commenced on 31 July 2017.

The 2016 financial statements were submitted to the OC&AG on 2 November 2017. The 2016 audit is scheduled to commence 15 January 2018.

For the 2017 financial statements, the accounting records for the former VECs have been amalgamated into a single database and consolidation will be necessary for the MSLETB accounts with the training centre only. While manual extension of the accounting records to include any unrecorded transactions and to allocate receipts and payments to the correct line items will be required, the financial statements production process and the audit process will be less complex. MSLELTB will submit the 2017 financial statements to the OC&AG by the statutory deadline of 1 April 2018.

Further measures being put in place to ensure the integrity of the accounting records include:

- reviews and spot checks on the classification of receipts and payments to ensure accurate recording.
- Analytical review where variances from budget or monthly variances will be investigated to ensure that transactions are properly classified.

MSLETB is also exploring the possibility of implementing a policy that all entries on the accounting system are double entry - which would require that bank accounts are recorded on the accounting system which would provide assurance that all receipts and payments are recorded.

# Mayo Sligo and Leitrim Education and Training Board

I have audited the financial statements of Mayo, Sligo and Leitrim Education and Training Board for the eighteen month period ended 31 December 2014 under the Education and Training Boards Act 2013 (the Act). The financial statements comprise the statement of accounting policies, the operating account, the statement of current assets and current liabilities and the related notes. The financial reporting framework applied in their preparation is that prescribed by the Minister for Education and Skills under the Act.

#### Responsibilities of the Board

The Board is responsible for preparation of the financial statements in accordance with the Act and the accounting policies laid down by the Minister for Education and Skills. The Board is also responsible for ensuring the regularity of transactions.

#### Responsibilities of the Comptroller and Auditor General

My responsibility is to audit the financial statements and report on them in accordance with the Act.

My audit is conducted by reference to the special considerations which attach to State bodies in relation to their management and operation.

My audit is carried out in accordance with the International Standards on Auditing (UK and Ireland) and in compliance with the Auditing Practices Board's Ethical Standards for Auditors.

### Scope of audit of the financial statements

An audit involves obtaining evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements, sufficient to give reasonable assurance that they are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or error. This includes an assessment of

- whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the Board's circumstances, and have been consistently applied and adequately disclosed
- the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made in the preparation of the financial statements, and
- the overall presentation of the financial statements.

I also seek to obtain evidence about the regularity of financial transactions in the course of audit.

# Basis for qualified opinion on the financial statements

There were weaknesses in the Board's accounting system in respect of the eighteen month period ending 31 December 2014, as explained in detail by the Board in the statement on internal control. Those weaknesses resulted in delays in the production of the financial statements, errors in the draft financial statements presented for audit, and challenges for the audit to obtain sufficient appropriate evidence to agree the financial statements to the underlying records. However, the audit was able, through substantial additional work, to gain reasonable assurance in respect of all material figures in the financial statements.

# Opinion on the financial statements, including a qualified opinion in relation to the keeping of adequate accounting records

In my opinion,

- the financial statements properly present the income and expenditure of the Board for the eighteen month period to 31 December 2014
- the statement of balances properly presents the state of affairs of the Board at 31 December 2014
- the financial statements are in accordance with the accounting policies laid down by the Minister for Education and Skills.

In my opinion, the Board did not keep adequate accounting records for the period ended 31 December 2014. In particular, the accounting records maintained for the period of account were not sufficient to

- facilitate the preparation of financial statements in a timely manner and in the required form, or
- enable the financial statements to be readily and properly audited.

### Matters on which I report by exception

I report by exception if I have not received all the information and explanations I required for my audit, or if I find

- any material instance where money has not been applied for the purposes intended or where the transactions did not conform to the authorities governing them, or
- the statement on internal control does not reflect the Board's compliance with the Code of Practice for the Governance of Vocational Education Committee (which applied to Educational and Training Boards during this period of account), or
- there are other material matters relating to the manner in which public business has been conducted.

#### Control and governance issues

The statement on internal control discloses a number of issues in respect of the period ended 31 December 2014, including control weaknesses in relation to the human resource systems, procurement, and documentation of procedures and recording of risks.

From a governance perspective, it is also disclosed that for this period of eighteen months

- the audit committee did not meet (a new audit committee was appointed in May 2015)
- · the finance committee met once
- there was no review by the Board of the effectiveness of the system of internal financial control.

#### Accounting Policies of the Financial Statements for the Eighteen Months Ended 31 December 2014

#### 1. Establishment of the Education and Training Board

Mayo, Sligo and Leitrim Education and Training Board was established on 1 July 2013. Counties Mayo, Sligo and Leitrim Vocational Education Committees (VECs) were dissolved on 30 June 2013 and all assets, liabilities and staff of the VECs transferred to the Education and Training Board on a going concern basis. Details of the assets and liabilities transferred are set out in note 14 to these financial statements.

SOLAS was established on 27 October 2013 and all functions, operations, assets and liabilities remaining with FÁS, which was dissolved on 26 October 2013, transferred to SOLAS.

On 1 July 2014, 45 staff, associated programmes, operations and systems, including associated assets and liabilities of Ballina and Sligo Training Centres transferred to the Education and Training Board on a going concern basis. Details of the associated assets and liabilities transferred from SOLAS are set out in Note 15 to these financial statements.

The functions of the Education and Training Board are set out in section 10 of the Education and Training Boards Act 2013.

#### 2. Significant Accounting Policies

#### (a) Format of account

The financial statements are presented in the form approved by the Minister for Education and Skills with the consent of the Minister for Finance and the Minister for Public Expenditure and Reform. They consist of a Statement of Accounting Policies, an Operating Account, A Statement of Current Assets and Current liabilities and notes to the financial statements.

The financial statements are the first accounts of the Education and Training Board and set out the financial results for the eighteen month period from 1 July 2013 to 31 December 2014.

#### (b) Basis of Preparation

The Operating Account presents Receipts and Payments by Programme Grouping and the resultant Cash Surplus/(Deficit) is adjusted for debtor and creditor movements to determine the overall result for the period on an accrual basis.

The Statement of Current Assets and Current Liabilities is prepared on the accruals basis by determining state grant and other funder balances at amounts that reflect the related expenditure incurred and in accordance with the funding rules.

Third Party Debtors are included in Current Assets . Pay and Expense Liabilities are included in Current Liabilities.

#### (c) Tangible fixed assets

All assets purchased including land and buildings, fixtures and fittings and training equipment are expensed in the year the acquisition payments are made. State grants received to fund the purchase of tangible fixed assets are taken to income in the year received.

#### (d) Stocks

All consumable stocks are charged to expenditure as incurred.

#### (e) Superannuation

The pension entitlements of Education and Training Board staff, including those who transferred from SOLAS in 2014 are conferred under 10 defined benefits schemes, (Vocational Teachers Superannuation Scheme - 1956 Scheme,: Revised Scheme 1977; Education Sector Superannuation Scheme - Revision 2004 Non New Entrants, Revision 2004 New Entrants post 1.4.2004; Single Public Service Pension Scheme 2012; Solas Open Scheme - Entrants 1.4.95 - 5.4.04, New Entrants Post 5.4.2004 Min 65, SACNMS Spouse and Child - Seconded Civil Servants, FAS Scheme D1 Rate; Solas Closed Scheme - Former ANCO Closed Scheme].

Superannuation deductions made from employees pay in respect of the Single Pension Scheme are paid over to the Department of Public Expenditure and Reform. Deductions in respect of all other pension schemes are retained by the ETB as part of agreed Exchequer funding.

The Education and Training Board does not make any contributions towards the schemes and has no obligation in respect of entitlements.

#### (f) Leased assets

All lease rentals are recognised in the period in which payments are made.

He continued to be renumerated as a CE until 31 August 2013, when he resumed his role as a School Principal. He was paid €16,262, including employers PRSI, for the two months from 1 July 2013 to 31 August 2013 - an arrangement approved by the Department of Education and Skills. He did not incur any foreign travel expenses. He is a member of an unfunded defined benefit public sector pension scheme and the pension entitlements do not extend beyond the standard entitlements available under the scheme.

On 1 July 2013, The CE of Mayo VEC transferred to the Department of Education and Skills in a non-ETB role and continues to be paid a CE salary by MSLETB, which is funded by the Department of Education and Skills. She is a member of an unfunded defined benefit public sector pension scheme and the pension entitlements do not extend beyond the standard entitlements available under the scheme.

#### 18 Capital Commitments

At the end of 2014, the ETB had committed and contracted to to build an extension to Davitt College, Castlebar, Co Mayo, at a cost of €645,325, an extension to Drumshanbo Vocational School, Drumshanbo, Co Leitrim, at a cost of €818,000 and a number of smaller projects amounting to about €350,000 - totalling €1.8 million - all of which will be Exchequer funded.

#### 19 Contingencies

At the date of approval of these financial statements legal proceedings in respect of events that occurred before 31 December 2014, have been initiated against Mayo, Sligo and Leitrim Education and Training Board.

These proceedings may have a net cost to Mayo, Sligo and Leitrim ETB of €100,000.
