APOLOGIES FOR INABILITY TO ATTEND MEETING.

Apologies for inability to attend Meeting were received from Mmes. T. Whelan, M.C.C., and S. Finan and Messrs. T. Connolly, M.C.C., J. Queenan, S.C.C., E. Cawley, P. Ainsworth, and K. O'Dowd.

ADOPTION OF MINUTES

The Minutes of the Meeting held on 23rd October, 2018, were adopted on the proposal of Ms. Tereasa McGuire, seconded by Ms. M. Gormley.

FINANCIAL REPORT.

Mr. P. Howley presented the combined Financial Report for Mayo, Sligo and Leitrim Education and Training Board and circulated details of the Receipts and Payments to the end of November, 2018. Total expenditure amounted to €73,210,000 with total receipts of €75,277,000. Total expenditure on the Capital Account amounted to €862,000, with total receipts of €671,000. The Bank Balance at the end of November 2018 was €10,910,538.

The Meeting approved the Financial Report (Appendix 1), on the proposal of Mr. P. O'Rourke, seconded by Ms. D. Sheridan.

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BUILDING REPORT.

Mr. P. Howley, Director of OSD presented the Building Report for Mayo, Sligo and Leitrim Education and Training Board – Appendix 2.

Mr. P. O'Rourke spoke regarding Carrigallen Vocational School proceeding to Design Stage and requested appraisal costs as noted at our last Board Meeting. He further pointed out the recent announcement of a new school being built in Ballyconnell, Co Cavan by Cavan, Monaghan ETB which will encroach on our catchment.

Ms. M. Gormley asked for an update on North Connaught College. Mr. P. Howley informed her that tenders are back for the purchase of equipment for the Beauty Therapy Course, Mr. P. Egan has invested in this from the Further Education Budget.

ORGANISATIONAL SUPPORT AND DEVELOPMENT

Mr P. Howley, Director of OSD presented the Organisational Support and Development Report for Mayo, Sligo and Leitrim Education and Training Board – Appendix 3.

Mr. P. Howley clarified for Ms. M. Bohan that it was an Organisation that requested the Freedom of Information (FOI) Request, in relation to fire safety audits carried out in schools in Leitrim.

Ms. T. McGuire commended the Director of OSD and APO Finance on their visit to schools across MSLETB. She modelled the value of the personal contact allowing the schools to feel connected and to understand what's happening on the ground. The CE concurred with her sentiments.

I.T. REPORT.

Mr. P. Howley, presented the I.T. Report for Mayo, Sligo and Leitrim Education and Training Board – Appendix 4.

FURTHER EDUCATION AND TRAINING REPORT.

Mr. Peter Egan, Director of FET, presented the Further Education and Training Report for Mayo, Sligo and Leitrim Education and Training Board – Appendix 5. Mr. E. Stenson requested greater awareness for Youthreach provision now in Mohill, Co. Leitrim. He was assured that all the Principals are aware of its existence and that there would be a launch of the facility early in 2019. Following a tour of the new FET Centre, Market Yard, Carrick on Shannon, Ms. M. Bohan complemented Peter Egan, Director of FET and Pat Howley, Director of OSD on this impressive facility and suggested that the next time the MSLETB Board are meeting in Carrick we will utilise the building. Ms. T. McGuire congratulated Peter Egan on the Annex Suite in Westport College of Further Education and said it was a first class premium quality space for Adult Learners. Mr. P. Egan advised that the Westport College of Further Education is the leading College outside Teagasc in the delivery of Level 5 and Level 6 Agriculture Awards. These Awards are being redeveloped and a Consultation Event with stakeholders will take place in Westport on 10th January.

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SCHOOLS REPORT.

Ms. M. Madden, Director of Schools, presented the Schools Report for Mayo, Sligo and Leitrim Education and Training Board – **Appendix 6.**


Ms. M. Madden brought to the attention of the Board the 'Grants payable to Non-Fee Paying Voluntary Secondary Schools' Irish and Bilingual Grant (€103 per student where all subjects are taught through Irish) not sanctioned for the ETB sector or C&C schools and to request parity with Voluntary Secondary Schools, run by religious congregations. The ETB sector has made representation of this disparity through the Senior Executives in the Department of Education and Skills, the Secretary General, ETBI Secretary General (past and present) and the Ministers for Education both past and present. The National Executive of ACCS addressed this issue and have agreed to pursue the matter with DES in cooperation with ETBI. NAPD is also raising the issue nationally on behalf of the 40+ schools affected. Both TUI and PDA have agreed to probe the matter further with DES as principals are unhappy that necessary funding, specified by DES Circular Letter, remains unavailable to them. In our situation MSLETB has 1 Gaelcholáiste − Coláiste Chomain, Ros Dumhach and 1 school in a Gaeltacht Recognition Scheme − St. Brendan's College, Belmullet within its administration. Ms. M. Bohan requested a letter be sent requesting this grant be made available to MSLETB.

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Department of Education and Skills: The CE informed the Board Members that following our last Meeting, a response to letter dated 1st October, 2018 from Seán Ó Foghlú. Office of the Secretary General, Department of Education and Skills had been sent, regarding the review of Report of the Statutory Investigation into Kildare and Wicklow Education and Training Board. MSLETB response affirmed our commitment to working appropriately with the Internal Audit Unit for the ETBs in relation to any items raised which may steer their audit programme in to the future and it stated we are confident that we are unaffected in MSLETB by any of the issues raised, however, in the event that any issues are identified, they will be notified to the Secretary General.

DES: Letter dated 30th November 2018 Re St. Joseph's Secondary school, Foxford, Co. Mayo (Roll No. 64640W) approval of 3 x classrooms, 1 x engineering room, 1 x construction studies room, 2 x science laboratories, 1 technologies preparation room, 1 shared science preparation room and 2 x pastoral offices. The total floor area is 1,094m². Given the significant scope and scale of the project in question and as per standard practice in respect of the budget associated with this project (in excess of €1million), the Department requests MSLETB to provide support and assistance to St. Joseph's Secondary School in delivering this project. The Department considers that the ETB s experience in delivering capital projects, project management and public procurement would be of significant help to the school authorities in dealing with the complexity of arrangements surrounding the progression of their project concerned.

While the BOM at St. Joseph's Secondary School will retain ultimate responsibility for delivering the project, it is envisaged that arrangements would be put in place whereby MSLETB will, in addition to ongoing assistance, also provide a check and overview of the processes being followed. The Department is appreciative of the support being offered to St. Joseph's Secondary School, by the ETB and our buildings section.

Director of OSD, Mr. P. Howley, contacted Justin O'Brien in the Building Department, DES, regarding this correspondence. He advised him that we would be happy to offer some guidance on this project but currently we have a significant workload of building and estates work concerning our own MSLETB schools and centres. This will seriously reduce the amount of input we can offer to St Joseph's Secondary School, Foxford. he explained that we currently have only one person working on buildings and estates and this function is under pressure as it is. Promising anything else at this stage would only be misleading to the Department and St Joseph's.
